



**MAGNOLIA GRANDIFLORA**

**"Bull Bay"**

Commonly known as the southern magnolia or bull bay, is a tree of the family Magnoliaceae. Reaching 27.5 m (90 ft) in height, it is a large striking evergreen tree with large dark green leaves and large white fragrant flowers.



**TILIA PLATYPHYLLOS**

**"Lime Tree"**

The Broad-leaved Lime is a native of Britain. It is a compact and stocky tree, the luscious foliage always gives it a healthy demeanour. A large, fast growing tree with a roughly fissured bark, which remains relatively free of suckers.



**SORBUS AUCUPARIA**

**"Mountain Ash"**

This tree suits bird life as the profuse red autumn berries provide a lot of autumnal sustenance. It prefers shorter day lengths and does not thrive in areas with excessive reflective heat and light such as paved and other hard surfaces.



**TILIA CORDATA**

**"Littleleaf Linden"**

A large tree that has a broadly oval crown, with small, heart shaped leaves, which are dark green on top and pale green beneath. Its creamy white flowers are produced in July. It is a relatively sedate grower.



**QUERCUS ROBUR**

**"English Oak"**

This is a large, imposing, broad, heavy-limbed tree. Its deeply grained bark gives year-round appeal, and its expansive root system does best on deep, heavy soils. The English Oak Tree is a great host for supporting wildlife.
